She has been Deputy Director General of Energy Planning of the Government of Spain, Head of Foresight at Iberdrola Renovables, Senior Analyst for Electricity Markets at the International Energy Agency in the OECD and Regulatory Economist at Ofgem, the regulatory authority for the electricity and gas markets in the United Kingdom. Likewise, as a career civil servant within the General State Administration, she was Advisor for energy matters to the Secretary of State for the Economy and Energy Advisor at the Permanent Representation of Spain to the EU.
